PRISM™ ACRYLIC-VINYL FLAT / LOW SHEEN / SEMI GLOSS

DESCRIPTION

- Prism™ Acrylic Vinyl is a waterborne acrylic coating that can be applied to most surfaces to give a pleasant finish – available in flat, low sheen and semi gloss.

BENEFITS

- Washable.
- Low Sheen has excellent touch-up properties.

RECOMMENDED USE

- Suitable for both interior and exterior use.

BASIC DATA

- **APPLICATION:** May be applied by brush, spray or roller to give smooth uniform film.
- **COVERAGE RATE:** Approximately 16 square metres per litre.
- **GLOSS LEVEL:** Flat, Low Sheen, Semi Gloss
- **THINNER:** Up to 10% water.
- **CLEAN UP:** Water with a little detergent, before paint dries.
- **RE-COAT:** 2 hours.
- **COLOUR RANGE:** White and tinted shades.

SURFACE PREPARATION

- Surfaces should be sound, dry, free of dirt, loose particles and any traces of wax, grease or oil.
- **Highly glazed surfaces** should be lightly sanded to provide a mechanical ‘key’ then primed with Gem™ Acrylic Undercoat after sanding to provide a mechanical “key”.
- **Metal surfaces** should be primed first with the appropriate primers.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

- On a normal surface apply 1 coat of Gem™ Acrylic Undercoat or Prism™ Prep Coat.
- Then apply 2 coats of Prism™ Acrylic Vinyl:
 - First coat may be thinned with up to 10% water.
 - Apply second coat direct from container or thinned with up to 5% water in warm weather.
- **Plaster Walls:** Apply 2 coats directly after recommended primer.
- **Rendered Walls:** Apply 2 coats directly after recommended primer.
- **Galvanized Surfaces:** Apply 1 coat of Gem™ Gutter Primer followed by 2 coats of Prism™ Acrylic-Vinyl.

SAFETY

- Ensure adequate ventilation during use.
- Avoid contact with skin and eyes.
- Do not pour left over paint down any drains.
- **FIRST AID:** If swallowed, induce vomiting, drink plenty of water and seek immediate medical assistance.
If in eyes, rinse with lots of water for at least 15 minutes – seek medical assistance.
If skin contact occurs, wash with warm soapy water – contact a doctor if irritation persists.
